Race 1 – Stewards Inquiry into the top of the stretch regarding #6 “Absolute Jewel” ridden by Rico Walcott. Rico was last and making a move between horses and ran up on the heels of #1 “A Gal for T J” ridden by Rafael Hernandez who did not change his path and unaware of the incident. No action taken, Mr. Walcott was taken off the rest of his mounts.

Race 2 - Clear

Race 3 – Rider Claim of Foul (COF) by Eswan Flores aboard #4 “Onandonandon” against #5 “Speedy Johnny” ridden by Juan Crawford for interference leaving the gate. Eswan said that after watching the replay, it was the inside horse that actually caused the problem and that one finished behind me. Juan said his horse took a step in but the inside horse came out into my horse. After review, the COF was disallowed.

Race 4 – Jockey Claim of Foul (COF) by Leo Salles aboard #8 “Perfect Play” against #3 “Mister Meseeks” with Luis Contreras and #4 “Rockland Express” ridden by Kazushi Kimura for interference in deep stretch. Leo also claimed that the #3 squeezed him around the turn but video evidence does not support it. Leo said both horses squeezed him in the stretch and it cost him a position. Kazushi who was on the outside, said he kept his horse straight and the inside horses came out to him. Luis said he felt the pressure was from the outside and he was keeping his path. After review, #4 Kimura does take a step in but it is the inside horse #3 with Contreras that comes out and pushes Leo into the #4. #3 was disqualified from second and placed third behind #8.
